Change of editor

Niels Kingo Jacobsen, Vice-President of the Royal Danish Geographical Society and Professor Emeritus at the Geographical Institute, Copenhagen University, has recently retired as chief editor of Geografisk Tidsskrift. He took over the job from the former vice-president, Professor Niels Nielsen, at the beginning of the fifties and since then, he has continuously published more than 40 issues of Geografisk Tidsskrift.
