WOJCIECH MAŁECKI is Assistant Professor at the Institute of Polish Philology, the University of Wrocław, Poland. His research concentrates on pragmatist philosophy (both classical and contemporary), literary theory, aesthetics, popular culture, and the Frankfurt School. His publications include articles in various peer-reviewed journals, book chapters as well as two edited volumes. Most recently, he was a visiting research fellow at the Institute for Advanced Studies in the Humanities, the University of Edinburgh, and at the John F. Kennedy Institute for North American Studies, Freie Universität, Berlin.

JUKKA MIKKONEN is Researcher at the Department of History and Philosophy at the University of Tampere and at the Department of Finnish Language and Cultural Studies at the University of Joensuu. Mikkonen's main research area is the cognitive value of literature. He is also an editor for the Finnish philosophical journal *niin & näin*.

KALLE PUOLAKKA received his PhD from the University of Helsinki (Aesthetics) in November 2009 with a thesis entitled *Reconsidering Relativism and Intentionalism in Interpretation: Donald Davidson, Hermeneutics, and Pragmatism*. He has published articles on philosophy of art and aesthetics, for example, in *Philosophia*, *SATS – Nordic Journal of Philosophy*, and *Contemporary Aesthetics*.

REINOLD SCHMÜCKER is Professor of Philosophy at the Westfälische Wilhelms-Universität (WWU), Münster, Germany. He is the author of a much-noticed book on the foundations of the philosophy of art (*Was ist Kunst? Eine Grundlegung*, Munich 1998) and has edited three volumes of the "Hamburg Edition" of the works of Ernst Cassirer. He has also (co-)edited several books and published articles on a wide range of topics from the field of aesthetics and the philosophy of art to ethics and political philosophy. He is currently working on a book on the ethics of international relations.

STEFÁN SNÆVARR is Professor of Philosophy at Lillehammer University College, Norway. He has written books of various kinds in three languages, Icelandic, English, and Norwegian. His last published book was *Kunstfilosofi: En kritisk innføring (Philosophy of Art: A Critical Introduction)*. In a short while, the Dutch-American publishing house Rodopi is going to publish his book *Metaphors, Narratives, Emotions. Their Impact and Interplay*.

SOMOGY VARGA has worked at the Institute of Social Research in Frankfurt am Main and did his PhD in philosophy at the Johann W. Goethe University of Frankfurt. He is currently working at the University of Osnabrück doing research on emotions and psychopathology. He has published on aesthetics, philosophy of mind, social philosophy, phenomenology, and psychopathology.

NICK ZANGWILL is Professor of Philosophy at Durham University. He is the author of *The Metaphysics of Beauty* (Cornell 2001) and *Aesthetic Creation* (Oxford 2007).

Submitting a paper to The Nordic Journal of Aesthetics

Articles submitted for publication and all editorial inquiries should be addressed to the editor Jacob Lund: jacoblund@hum.au.dk

Before preparing your submission, please refer to our web site for instructions for contributors and style guide: <http://www.nsaе.аu.dk/en/journal>

Manuscripts should be submitted as Word files by e-mail attachment. Submissions should not be under consideration for publication elsewhere. Articles should not exceed 7500 words, though in certain cases exceptions may be made. Please include on a separate cover sheet an abstract of a maximum of 150 words and a short biographical note on the author. Manuscripts should be written according to the specifications of *The Chicago Manual of Style*: www.chicagomanualofstyle.org

All quotations from a language other than English must be translated. The original quotation can be included in the endnotes. A list of any illustrations can be included at the end of the main body of the text. Articles should be double-spaced, including quotations and notes. These guidelines also apply to book reviews (book notes should not normally exceed 1500 words, book reviews 5000 words, and review essays 7500 words).

All submissions that are not invited will be subjected to blind review. The author's name should therefore not appear on manuscripts and any reference to the author's previous work should be in the third person.

It is the responsibility of the author to secure permission to reproduce all illustrations.
