Russia the “European Court of Human Rights found a violation of Article 3 of the Convention as the applicant had only six hours of sleep per night” (p. 6). It should say that “European Court of Human Rights, despite no violation being found in that case, found that a minimum of six hours of sleep per night was required before Article 3 of the Convention was breached.”
